#### CADA DRESS CODE

# RULE 1 - JUVENILE (effective April 6 2007)

#### 1.01 Beginner [Newcomer], Pre-Bronze, Bronze, Silver, Gold – Standard and Latin

No competition costumes allowed

## Girls:

#### Dance Wear

- Leotard with wrap-over skirt or a simple dress is allowed
- Sequins, rhinestones or similar decorations are not allowed on skirt and dress
- One simple circular underskirt is allowed
- Must have sleeves
- No bare midriffs
- No more than 10 cm above the knee and no longer than 10cm below the knee
- The panties of the dress have to cover the underwear

#### > Color

- Dress made with a print fabric or a solid color fabric is allowed
- Dress must be of the same fabric throughout
- Combination of different color fabrics is not allowed
- Skin color and see through inserts are not permitted

#### Hairstyles

Too elaborate hairstyles are not desirable

#### Make Up

- Only moderate amount of make up is allowed
- No artificial nails, tan or lashes

#### Materials

- Materials must not have metallic thread, or be decorated with sequins, lace, diamante, rhinestones, fluorescent paint, feathers, fringe, bows or any other similar trimmings
- Any color except skin color

# Shoes

- ❖ Block heel only with a maximum height of 3.5 cm
- High heel shoes are not permitted
- Shoes may be worn with short socks
- Skin color tights may be worn but mesh tights are not allowed

#### Boys:

#### Dance Wear

- ❖ Black trousers, plain white or black shirt with black tie or bow tie
- No wing collar or rolled up sleeves allowed
- Shirt must be tucked in
- ❖ For Latin black turtle neck will be permitted and black tie or bow tie is optional

# PROHIBITED MATERIALS AND STYLES

# [SEE IDSF DRESS REGULATIONS - APPENDIX 1 AND 2 FOR JUVENILE STYLES]

#### Girls:

- slash-neck leotard or dress with one sleeve
- leotard or dress with shoe string straps or straps of any description
- leotard or dress with straps and body stocking or similar see-through material inserts
- skirt with feathered trim, fringe, fringe trim, or tiered frills
- skirt made up of strips
- skirt with frill and split up front
- > skirt with wired frills must not have splits up front, back or side

- sleeveless leotard or dress with frills on shoulder
- slashed thighs or cut-out bodices front or back
- bare midriff

# Boys:

- satin or similar shiny material
- extra full sleeves

# 1.02 Pre-Championship, Championship – Standard and Latin

Competition style costumes or follow dress code in Rule 1.01 above [See IDSF Junior II Dress Code Rules for restrictions]

#### Girls:

- Shoes
  - Block heel only with a maximum height of 3.5 cm
  - High heel shoes are not permitted
  - Shoes may be worn with short socks
  - Skin color tights may be worn but mesh tights are not allowed

#### **RULE 2 - JUNIOR**

# 2.01 Beginner [Newcomer], Pre-Bronze, Bronze - Standard and Latin

> Follow dress code in Rule 1.01 above

#### Girls:

- High heels are permitted
- Excessive makeup is not desirable
- Too elaborate hairstyles are not desirable

# 2.02 Silver, Gold - Standard and Latin

- Costumes Optional [See IDSF Junior II Dress Code Rules for restrictions]
- Both members of the partnership must either be in costume or both in the dress code described under Rule 1 - Juveniles above [Not a mixture of the two dress codes]

# Girls:

- The top of the dress must be attached to the bottom in such a fashion that the naval area is covered
- Pants, jeans, shorts, or jumpsuits are not permitted

#### 2.03 Pre-Championship, Championship – Standard and Latin

Competition style costumes must be worn [See IDSF Junior II Dress Code Rules for restrictions]

# **RULE 3 – ADULT, YOUTH AND SENIOR**

# 3.01 Beginner [Newcomer], Pre-Bronze, Bronze - Standard and Latin

- ➤ BC may elect to have costumes optional in Bronze level until June 1, 2008
- Both members of the partnership must either be in costume or both in the dress code described under this Rule 3.01 - [Not a mixture of the two dress codes]

# Ladies:

- No costumes are allowed
- Day dress, or skirt and blouse
- Dress must not be decorated with sequins, diamante, rhinestones, feathers, fringe, or similar decorations

- Dress or skirt must be between mid thigh and mid calf in length
- Bare midriffs, openings in the skirt in the front, side or back, pants, jeans, or jumpsuits are not permitted

# Gentlemen:

#### Standard:

- No costumes are allowed
- ❖ Jacket, white or black shirt, black tie, and suitable trousers
- Men may use a plain black or navy blue colored vest or cardigan in place of the jacket [No studio or club logos allowed]
- Men may not compete in just a shirt

#### > Latin:

- No costumes are allowed
- ❖ A plain black or navy blue colored vest or cardigan [No studio or club logos allowed]
- White or black shirt, black tie optional, and suitable trousers or a black turtle neck and suitable trousers
- Jeans, leather pants, sequins, diamante, rhinestones, or similar decorations are not allowed

# 3.02 Silver, Gold, Pre-Championship, Championship – Standard and Latin

- See IDSF Dress Regulations
- Some Regions may elect to have costumes optional in Silver level
- ➤ Both members of the partnership must either be in costume or both in the dress code described under this Rule 3.02 [Not a mixture of the two dress codes]

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# IDSF DRESS REGULATIONS

[In Canada these Dress Regulations apply to Silver and higher or in any category that requires a costume]

These Regulations are part of the IDSF Competition Rules by reference in Rule 12

## **Authority and Applicability**

These Dress Regulations apply to all IDSF named events and according to the decision of the IDSF Annual General Meeting, form part of the national competition rules for all IDSF national members, except that IDSF national members may impose additional dress restrictions at their own discretion for national non-IDSF-named events.

The IDSF Presidium retains the authority to impose specific additional or general dress restrictions or otherwise amend or allow exemptions, for specific events.

#### **GENERAL**

- 1. Dresses **have to** create Characteristic shape for each discipline (ST and LA) (shape area).
- 2. Dresses **have to** cover the intimate parts of the dancers bodies (intimacy area).
- 3. Dresses and make-up **have to** respect age and level of dancers.
- 4. Using of religious symbols as decoration or decoration jewellery is **not allowed** (this does not apply to personal jewellery).
- 5. The chairman can ask the competitor to remove an item of jewellery or dress if it presents danger to the dancer or to other competitors.
- 6. It is allowed to dance in dresses for lower categories.

#### **Good Taste Rule**

Any use of material or color or construction or other contrivance that gives the appearance of non compliance with these dress rules, even though there is no breach of the literal wording of these rules, will be a breach of these rules if so determined by the Chairman of Adjudicators.

#### **SANCTIONS**

If a couple is not dressed in accordance with this Dress Regulation and receives a warning from the Chairman of adjudicators, they have to comply with the regulation or face disqualification **IMMEDIATELY BY THE CHAIRMAN**. The presidium can impose additional sanctions including suspension from competitions for repeat offenders.

### **DEFINITIONS OF TERMS**

No restriction (NR) – there are no restrictions in this matter

Not allowed (NA),

Only allowed (OA),

**Intimacy area (IA)** – body zones, which **have to** be covered by non transparent materials or transparent materials lined with non transparent materials. If skin color is used, it **has to** be **SwD.** 

#### For Female partner:

- tangas are NA.
- skin colors panties are NA.
- Breasts have to be covered
- the distance between bra cups has to be less than 5 cm.

**Shape area (SA)** – minimum area which **has to** be covered. Transparent materials are allowed in these areas, any color is allowed.

Basic material – creates shape of the dress

- with light effects (metallic, glitter, sequined, ...)
- without light effects

**Decoration** – anything fixed on the basic material, hair, skin:

- with light effects (rhinestones, seguins, beads, pearls, ...)
- without light effects (feathers, flowers, bows, fringe, lace applications, ribbons, ...)

Tie clips, studs, cufflinks, buckles are not thought of as decorations.

# **Hip Line (HL)** – panties top line (how low)

= straight horizontal line, top of line between buttocks muscles (intergluteal line) **must not** be visible.

Panty Line (PL) – panties bottom line (how high)

- back side whole buttocks are covered
- in the front follows line between flexed leg and body

The distance between HL and PL on the side has to be more than 5 cm

# Man's Top Opening Point (TOP) - point, to which top or shirt can be opened

= centre of the belt buckle or centre of the trousers top line

# Colors


- black only (Bo)
- black (B) means black and midnight blue
- white (W)
- skin color (S) -equal to the color of the dancer's skin during the competition (with tan)
- skin color with decoration (SwD)
- any color (C) any color inc. mixed colors
- any color except skin color (CnS)
- one color except skin color (C1nS)

Long Sleeves/ed (LS) – length to the wrist, rolled up sleeves are NA

**Make-up** – includes face make-up, artificial tan, artificial nails, artificial eyelashes.

Decoration jewellery – a jewellery designed to be a part of a dance dress




